

Guidelines for GCPR 2002 Camera-Ready Submission

Important information

- **Deadline for camera-ready submission: October 19.**
- **Please carefully take into account the reviewers' comments when preparing the camera-ready version.**
- **If you received feedback during the conference, feel free to update your paper accordingly. However, as with the original submission, the page limit still remains 12 pages (excluding references).**
- The L^AT_EX author kit for the camera ready manuscripts is slightly different from that for the initial submission. It is based on a more recent version of llncs.cls (LNCS style file) and splncs04.bst (LNCS BibTex style file). The only change for the authors compared to the original submission is to use these two files instead of the previous ones. To use splncs04.bst, replace the line `\bibliographystyle{splncs03}` with `\bibliographystyle{splncs04}`.
- Make sure to appropriately replace all placeholders (for double-blind reviewing) in the initial submission. In particular, make sure to comment out the line `\GCPRreviewversion`. Also, provide the author information and running title for the page headers (abbreviated if necessary).
- Springer enables the ORCID identifier for proceedings, ultimately providing authors with a digital identifier that distinguishes them from every other researcher. Please see <https://www.springer.com/gp/authors-editors/orcid> for more details. We encourage the authors to include it in their paper (application of an individual ORCID-ID at www.orcid.org).
- Each accepted paper is limited to 12 pages (there is no page limit for references). Do not reduce the paper length e.g. by reducing vertical spaces between paragraphs or the like. In particular, do not use the `\vspace` command to reduce vertical spacing.

* The 16-digit number is the ORCID ID.

- All figures will be printed in black and white. If you have color figures, please make sure that they are also legible in black and white. These figures will appear in color in the online version at no extra charge.

What to submit?

- a text file "contact.txt" containing the name and email address of the corresponding author.
- PDF file of the final version.
- \LaTeX source files: tex, bib, and figure files. Please name the main file as "XXX-main.tex".¹ Please make sure to include the following:
 - All source files, e.g. LaTeX2e files for the text, PS/EPS or PDF/JPG files for all figures.
 - Make sure to include any further style files and fonts you may have used.
 - References are to be supplied as BBL files to avoid omission of data while conversion from BIB to BBL.
 - Please do not send any older versions of papers. There should be one set of source files and one XXX.pdf file per paper. Springer's typesetters require the author-created pdfs in order to check the proper representation of symbols, figures, etc.
 - You may use sub-directories.
 - Make sure to use relative paths for referencing files.
 - Make sure the source you submit compiles. In particular, the resulting pdf should be identical to the XXX.pdf file provided by you.
- any non-standard style files, templates, and special fonts used for manuscript preparation.
- signed Consent to Publish form, through which the copyright of the paper is transferred to Springer. A prepared version of the form (with conference name and editor names) is available in the author kit. Please fill this form, sign it, and scan it as a single PDF file, named XXX-copyright.pdf. It is sufficient if one author signs the form on behalf of all the other authors.

Please create a single ZIP file XXX-paper.zip containing all the items above (ZIP is the only supported format for this submission).

It is possible to provide supplementary material (a single ZIP file named XXX-suppl.zip, maximum 50 MB). You can put anything in this file (PDFs, movies, code, additional results, accompanying technical reports) that may make your paper more useful to readers. If your supplementary material includes video or image data, you are advised to use common codecs and file formats. GCPR encourages authors to submit videos using an MP4 codec such as DivX contained

in an AVI. Also, please submit a README text file with information about the exact codec for each video and a URL where the codec can be downloaded. Importantly, authors should refer to the contents of the supplementary material appropriately in the paper.

How to submit?

Please submit XXX-paper.zip and, if appropriate, XXX-supp.zip through the paper camera-ready submission site at <https://cmt3.research.microsoft.com/DAGMGCP2020/>. You can submit more than once, in which case old versions will be overwritten.
